Course Details

The course will be conducted in English. The course is delivered over one and a half days. The first day starts at 9.00 am and ends at 5.00 pm, while the second day starts at 9.00 am and ends at 1.00 pm.

Course Entry Requirements

There are no entry requirements. The course is intended for candidates who:

- are new to the field of international arbitration;
- wish to learn more about international arbitration and its benefits to users; and
- wish to become an Associate member of CI Arb.

English Language Competence – as CI Arb trainings and assessments are carried out in English, it is essential that candidates are proficient in both written and spoken English. Where English is not a candidate's first language, it is recommended that they have achieved a standard that is, as a minimum, equivalent to level 7 in the International English Language Testing System (IELTS) or a score of 94-101 in the Test of English as a Foreign Language (TOEFL). CI Arb issues this advice as a guideline and, while it will not require any evidence of this prior to enrolment in a course, candidates who do not possess this standard of English may be disadvantaged.

Course Assessment

Assessment of this course is completed through an online multiple-choice test accessed via Moodle. Candidates will be given 28 days to complete and submit the assessment. Candidates must achieve a minimum overall mark of 55% to pass the course. Results are emailed to candidates after submission of the assessment.

Please note that the Course Fee does not include the CI Arb Online Assessment. Participants can register for the Online Assessment directly with CI Arb upon completion of this course.
